Chapter 15 Risk and Information (15.1, 15.2, 15.3, 15.4, including Learning-by-Doing Exercises)
Chapter 6 Inputs and Production Functions (6.1, 6.2, 6.3, 6.4, 6.5, 6.6, including Learning-by-Doing Exercises)
- 2) Questions are mixtures of concept checking questions (CCQs) and computational questions
