- The exam has two sections: a short-essay section and an essay section. Each section is worth half of the exam. All of the questions within each section have the same value.

- In the case of subjective questions, there is no “right” answer; the correct answer is your own well-reasoned opinion. Subjective questions will be graded according to how well you express your opinion, how well developed your opinion seems, and how well you support your opinion with relevant examples.

Short-Essay Questions: Answer all of the questions. All of the questions are worth the same number of points.

Keep your answers short and simple. Include just enough information to demonstrate that you know the answer to the question asked. Do not include irrelevant information.

Write all of your answers in the essay booklet, in the same order as found below. If you need to skip an answer, leave space in the essay booklet so that you can come back to it later.

There are 30 short-essay questions.

Essay Questions: Answer all of the questions. All the essay questions are worth the same number of points. Use your time wisely.

You should include as much information in your answer as time allows. Longer answers full of correct, relevant, information and examples will earn better scores than short, correct answers.
