All international students can remain in the UK for two years after graduation using the Post Study Work Visa. The visa grants you working rights in the UK, and you do not need to be sponsored by your employer.

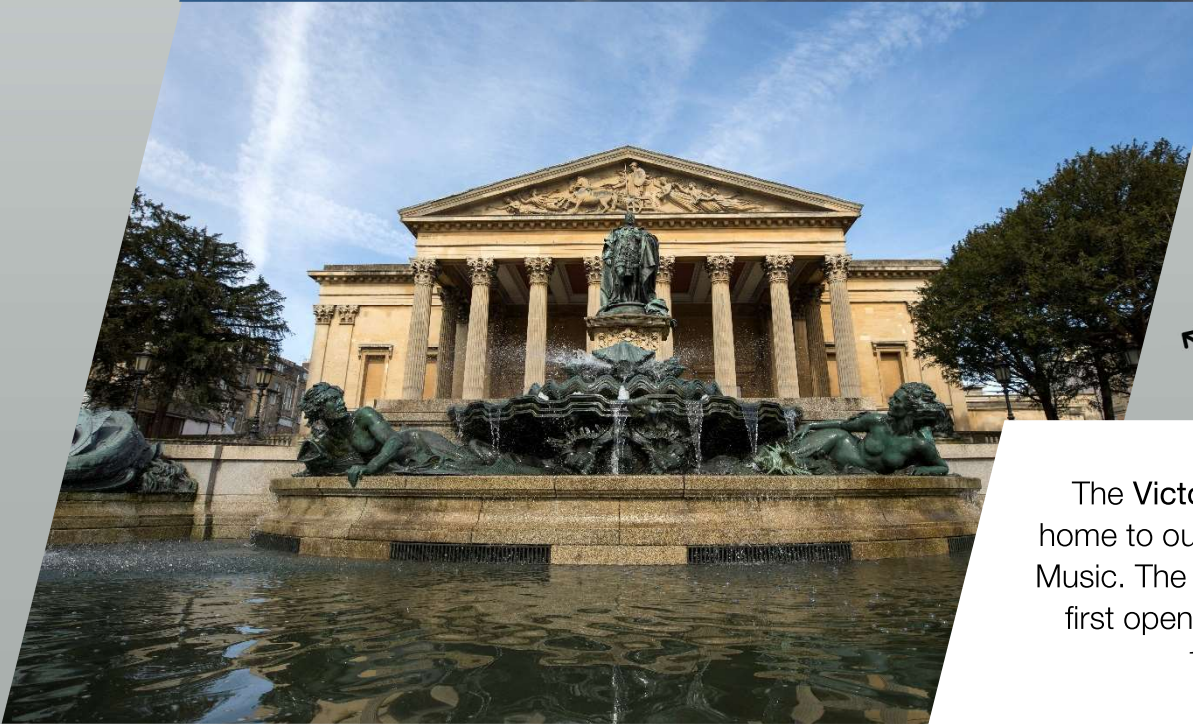
Things to do

Entry requirements

We welcome the brightest minds to our campus from across the world. Over 7,500 international students from 150+ different countries call Bristol their home.

To transfer to Bristol, you must meet our academic and English language requirements.

Academic

- You must achieve a **GPA 3.0**

English language

- Given that the Bachelor of Economics is delivered in English you will be exempt from needing to demonstrate your English Language level.



How to apply

You must apply by the **31 May 2022**. Select the relevant TU Economics, Management & Accounting and Finance Partnership Name on the application form.

Decide

You will need to accept your offer within two weeks. Your place is held until you provide your qualifications later in the summer.



Tuition Fees

Studying for your degree is an investment in your future, and we understand that financing your studies requires important decisions.

All students who apply through this partnership will receive an exclusive scholarship. **The UOB-TU Strategic Partner Scholarship will reduce your tuition fee by 10%.**

You do not need to apply for the scholarship, it will be automatically applied when you apply. However if you apply using an agent, you won't be eligible for a scholarship.

Your tuition fee will depend on the programme you are studying for the 2022/23 academic year. Check the table below to check the tuition fee amount for your programme, which **includes the 10% tuition fee discount.** Tuition fees will rise by a small amount each year to account for inflation. You should budget for an annual increase of 5%.

You can only receive one scholarship from Bristol. If you are shortlisted for multiple scholarships from Bristol, you will automatically receive the higher amount.



Cost of living

Your other living expenses will depend on your way of life. The cost of living in Bristol is around 25% cheaper than London. As a guide, most students spend in the region of £9,000 to £15,000 a year on living expenses, including accommodation, although you may spend more depending on your housing choices and lifestyle.

The Global Lounge enjoys celebrating the traditions and festivities that represent our community of students.

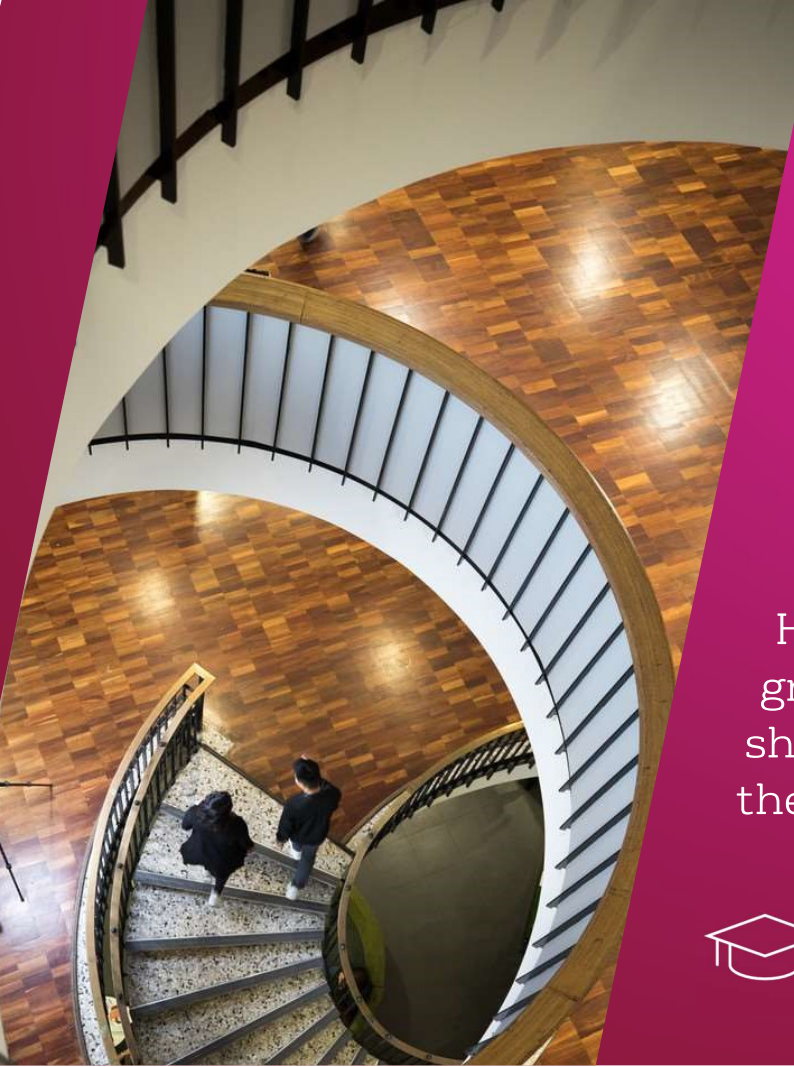
With nine specialist libraries, you'll have all the resources you need to support your studies.



With more than 400 clubs and societies, everyone can belong at Bristol. Bristol SU offers more than 70 sports clubs. All skill levels are welcome.

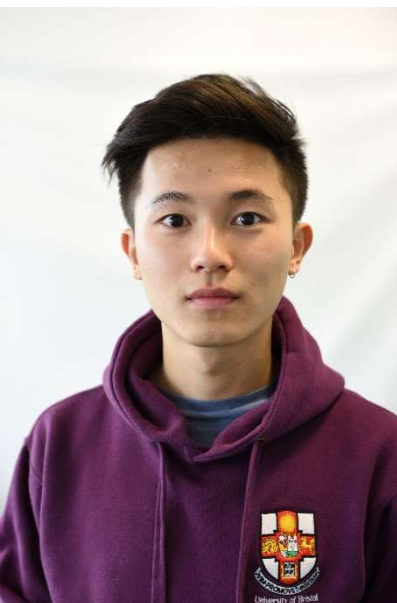
