Hello class,

If you have not already, you must register for the TU110 Moodle site:

<http://be-moodle.econ.tu.ac.th/course/view.php?id=47>

The registration code is 14888. Many important things are already happening there, such as the [plagiarism quiz homework assignment](#). There are also forums there where you can ask about the class, homework, the essay, and the group projects.

(About ten students in the class are not on this email list. They are probably the same ten students that haven't visited the class moodle page. Please ask your friends if they need to do either of these things. Thank you.)

The class has a second download page, courtesy of Google Sites:

All of the files available for download on the Moodle page are also available on the google site, but they are organized differently. If you think you have everything via email and moodle, you don't have to use the google site. However, there are a few files in the [Xtras page](#) that are not on Moodle.

To use the site, you must first login to a Google Account. If you use gmail, then you already have one. If you don't have a Google Account, sign up for one using the same email address that you sent to me. A Google Account does not have to use a gmail address, you can sign up for one using hotmail, yahoo, or any other email address.

Your permission to use the class download page is tied to the email address you sent to me. If you login to a Google Account that used a different email address, it will not let you into the class download page. If you have a Google Account with a different email address that you would like to use, send it to me and I will add it to the permitted user list.

Some students have had a problem getting into the class download page where they are given an error message that they "need permission to access this item." If this happens to you, be patient. I think this problem only occurs with just-opened Google Accounts. First, make sure you verify your Google Account before visiting the class download page. If you've already verified the account and you still can't get in, just try again an hour later. If it still doesn't work, let me know and I'll regrant your email address permission to use the site.
