Remarks:

- Offer = Courses offered in the given semester of every academic year. (Category 1)
- Offer (odd) = Course only offered in the given semester of odd-numbered academic years, e.g. 2021, 2023, ... (Category 2)
- Even = Course only offered in the given semester of even-numbered academic years, e.g. 2020, 2022, ... (Category 3)
- For any courses offered in every academic year, we reserve the right to cancel the offering in the given semester if the number of enrollment is insufficient.
- We will continuously monitor the demand for all courses offered under each category. The offerings plan will be periodically reviewed, and accordingly adjusted as we see fit. For example, if the demand for courses under category 2 and category 3 has continued to grow at a stable pace, they might be placed in category 1 and, hence being offered every academic year. On the other hand, if the demand for courses under category 1 has continuously decreased, we might offer those courses on every-other-year basis instead. To minimize the impact of revisions, any changes will be notified one academic year in advance.
