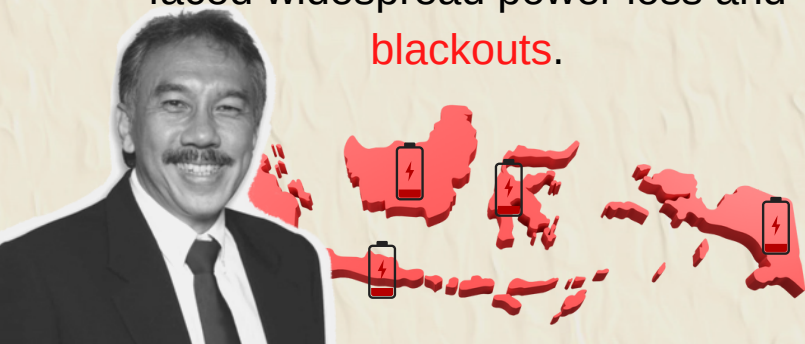
PERUSAHAAN LISTRIK NEGARA (PLN),

the state-owned electric company which generates the majority of the country's power and relies heavily on fossil fuels, said its stock was running critically low.

By December 31, the PLN had less than 1% of the coal it needed this month.

RIDWAN JAMALUDIN,

the ministry's director general for coal, mentioned that *without the ban*, islands, for example, Java and Bali may have faced widespread power loss and **blackouts**.



"It's beyond us and it's temporary. If the ban isn't enforced, almost 20 power plants with the power of 10,850 megawatts will be out," Ridwan said.
