

## **Notification on Preregistration Requests**

Below is the detailed consideration of the add/drop request. For the list of approved requests sorted by ID, please check the file supplement to this announcement.

### **Semester 1/2021**

1. EE463: GLOBALIZATION AND INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT by Dr. Januar Hakim. **This class will be conducted online until mid of October as the instructor will be teaching from the USA.** (By default, all other classes will be conducted on site.) Class date and time have been changed to **Monday from 9 AM - noon** due to the instructor being in a different time zone. Students with scheduling conflicts at the new time may contact BE Office.
2. All requests for EE376: ECONOMICS OF CLIMATE CHANGES are approved only for students with ID.62XXX.
  - For students with ID.63XXX, BE program will offer EE375: APPLIED ECONOMICS FOR NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENT; students who have already requested a place in EE376 will be assigned EE375 instead.
  - EE375 class schedule: Wednesdays and Fridays from 2 PM to 3:30 PM.
3. All requests for EE382: ECONOMICS OF SERVICES SECTOR will be denied for students with ID.63XXX. Students may enroll in this course next year.
  - Students with ID.62XXX will be offered **10 extra seats** in this course, and will be randomly selected from among students who have requested the course.
4. All requests for EE200: DATA SCIENCE FOR ECONOMIC ANALYSIS remain pending and an update will be announced before the BE portal (non EE) period.
  - 4.1 If the teaching format of semester 1/2021 is onsite, seating capacity in the computer room means that all requests for EE200: DATA SCIENCE FOR ECONOMIC ANALYSIS will be denied. Students may enroll in this course next year.
  - 4.2 Instead, if the teaching format of semester 1/2021 is officially changed to an online version, **20 extra seats will be added to** the usual class

limits; students with ID.62xxx who have requested these courses will be selected randomly.

5. The followings are the add/drop policy applied to seminar courses.
  - 5.1 Due to insufficient enrollment, the following course is cancelled:  
EE459: SEMINAR IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE THEORY AND POLICY
  - 5.2 Students who have pre-registered for EE489: SEMINAR IN INDUSTRIAL ECONOMICS for semester 1/2021, please email the BE Office at [lanlida@econ.tu.ac.th](mailto:lanlida@econ.tu.ac.th) by 7 May 2021 to confirm the preregistration. If fewer than ten students enroll, the course will be cancelled.
6. Due to limited preregistration demand, only one section will be offered for EE431: ECONOMICS OF FINANCIAL MARKETS AND INSTITUTIONS and EE452: INTERNATIONAL MONETARY AND FINANCIAL ECONOMICS. The second section will be cancelled.
7. Students who have asked to exchange from EE311: MICROECONOMICS THEORY, EE312: MACROECONOMIC THEORY, EE320: INTRODUCTORY MATHEMATICAL ECONOMICS, or EE325: INTRODUCTORY ECONOMETRICS, may edit courses after the BE portal (non EE) period. The changes have to be made under the condition of the remaining seats.
8. All requests made for other EE courses are approved.

## **Semester 2/2021**

1. Due to high demand for EE486: BUSINESS ECONOMICS, **22 extra seats** will be offered, students who have already requested the course will be randomly selected.
2. All requests for EE200: DATA SCIENCE FOR ECONOMIC ANALYSIS remain pending and an update will be announced before the BE portal (non EE) period.
  - 2.1 If the teaching format of semester 2/2021 is onsite, seating under normal capacity in the computer room means, **8 extra seats will be added to meet with the** seating limit under normal situation; students with ID.62xxx who have requested these courses will be approved.

2.2 Instead, if the teaching format of semester 2/2021 is officially changed to an online version, 20 extra seats will be added to the usual class limits; all requests will be approved.

3. Due to limited preregistration demand, only one section each will be offered of EE432: MONETARY THEORY AND POLICY, EE459: SEMINAR IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE THEORY AND POLICY, and EE482: INDUSTRIALIZATION: ROLE OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SECTORS. The second section will be cancelled.
4. Students who have asked to exchange from EE311: MICROECONOMICS THEORY, EE312: MACROECONOMIC THEORY, EE320: INTRODUCTORY MATHEMATICAL ECONOMICS, or EE325: INTRODUCTORY ECONOMETRICS, may edit courses after the BE portal (non EE) period. The changes have to be made under the condition of the remaining seats.
5. Students who have pre-registered for EE449: SEMINAR IN PUBLIC ECONOMICS, EE470; SEMINAR IN PUBLIC RESOURCES ECONOMICS, and EE479: SEMINAR IN HUMAN RESOURCES, NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL ECONOMICS for semester 2/2021 please email the BE Office at [lanlida@econ.tu.ac.th](mailto:lanlida@econ.tu.ac.th) by 7 May 2021 to confirm the pre-registration.
6. All requests made for all other EE courses are approved.
