

**Question 1** Fill in the blanks. You must show your work.

Year	2014	2015
Nominal gross national income (GNI) (\$ billion) <i>GNP</i>	291.53	292.56
Factor income sent abroad (\$ billion)	68.30	75.90
Factor income earned abroad (\$ billion)	8.13	9.49
Nominal gross domestic product (GDP) (\$ billion)	351.7	358.97
GDP deflator	100	100.88
Real GDP (\$ billion)	291.53	290

$$GDP_{2014} = GNI_{2014} - NFFI$$

$$= 291.53 - (8.13 - 68.30) = 351.7$$

$$GNI_{2015} = GDP_{2015} + NFFI$$

$$= 358.97 + (9.49 - 75.90) = 292.56$$

$$Real\ GDP = \frac{Nominal\ GDP}{GDP\ deflator} \times 100$$

$$Real\ GDP_{2014} = \frac{291.53}{100} \times 100 = 291.53$$

$$Real\ GDP_{2015} = \frac{292.56}{100.88} \times 100 = 290$$

$$Inflation\ rate_{2014} = \frac{Current\ CPI - Past\ CPI}{Past\ CPI} \times 100$$

$$= \frac{102.51 - 100.55}{100.55} \times 100 = 1.95$$

$$Inflation\ rate_{2015} = \frac{Current\ CPI - Past\ CPI}{Past\ CPI} \times 100$$

$$= \frac{107.52 - 102.51}{102.51} \times 100 = 4.89$$

$$Unemployment\ rate_{2012} = \frac{Unemployed}{Employed + Unemployed} \times 100 \approx 7.34$$

$$Unemployment\ rate_{2013} = \frac{Unemployed}{Employed + Unemployed} \times 100 \approx 5.33$$

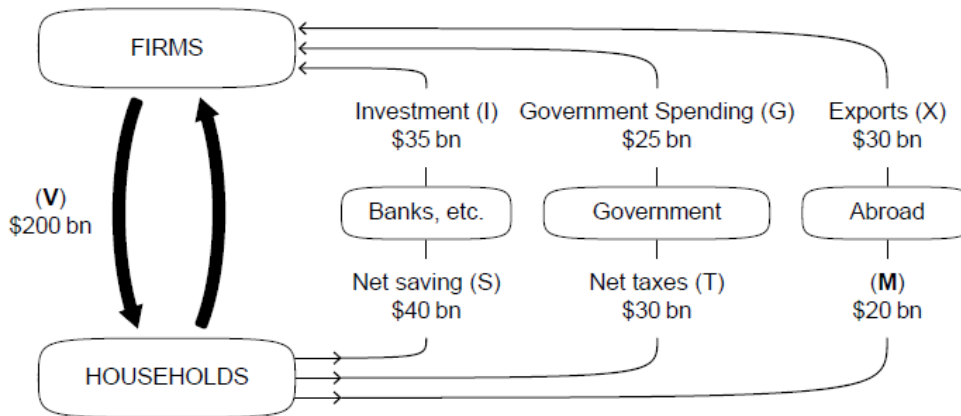
**Question 3** Calculate GDP and GNP. You must show your work.

Item	\$ billion
Imports	289
Transfer payments	253
Saving	82
Exports	234
Income from employment	1160
Taxation	396
Consumer spending	745
Investment	229
Net factor income from abroad	-111
Government spending on goods and services	437

$$GDP = C + I + G + (X - M) = 745 + 229 + 437 + (234 - 289) = 1356$$

$$GNP = GDP + \text{Net factor income from abroad} = 1356 + (-111) = 1245$$

$V = \text{Income}, M = \text{Import}$

4.2 Does the government run a budget deficit or surplus? By how much?

Government run a budget surplus by \$5 bn

The typical basket of goods purchased by an average consumer consists of 10 pizzas, 100 litres of chocolate milk and 10 jazz concerts.

6.1 With 2013 as the base year, calculate CPI of 2013 and 2014.

$$\begin{array}{l|l} \text{For 2013: } (12.5 \times 10) + (1.15 \times 100) + (45 \times 10) = 690 & \text{CPI in 2013} = \frac{690}{690} \times 100 = 100 \\ \text{For 2014: } (12.9 \times 10) + (1.25 \times 100) + (46 \times 10) = 714 & \text{CPI in 2014} = \frac{714}{690} \times 100 = 103.48 \end{array}$$

6.2 Calculate the inflation rate of 2014.

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Inflation rate} &= \frac{\text{Current CPI} - \text{Past CPI}}{\text{Past CPI}} \times 100 \\ &= \frac{103.48 - 100}{100} \times 100 = 3.48\% \end{aligned}$$

$$\text{Real GDP}_{2014} = \frac{\text{Nominal GDP}_{2014}}{\text{GDP deflator}_{2014}} \times 100 = \frac{308.12}{98.9} \times 100 = 311.55$$

$$\text{Annual real growth rate}_{2015} = \frac{\text{Real GDP}_{2015} - \text{Real GDP}_{2014}}{\text{Real GDP}_{2014}} \times 100 = \frac{321.99 - 311.55}{311.55} \times 100 = 3.35$$

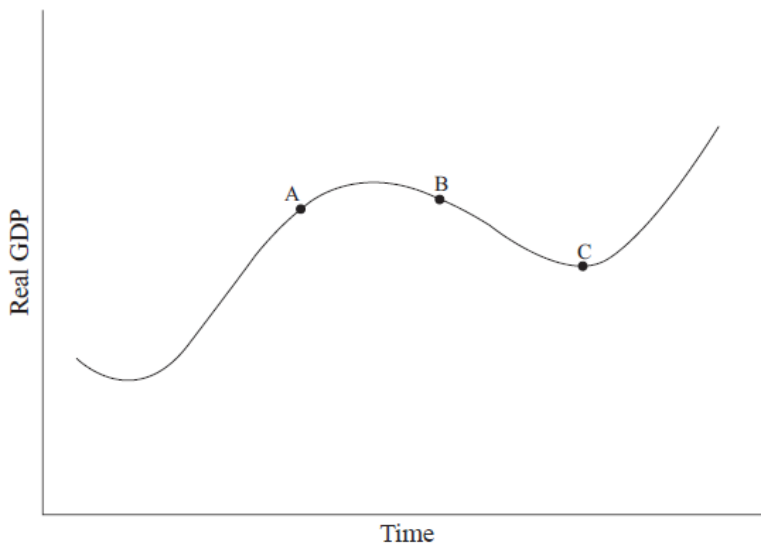
$$\text{Real GDP}_{2015} = \frac{321.99}{100} \times 100 = 321.99$$

$$\text{Annual real growth rate}_{2016} = \frac{\text{Real GDP}_{2016} - \text{Real GDP}_{2015}}{\text{Real GDP}_{2015}} \times 100 = \frac{325.49 - 321.99}{321.99} \times 100 = 1.09$$

$$\text{Real GDP}_{2016} = \frac{332.65}{102.2} \times 100 = 325.49$$
