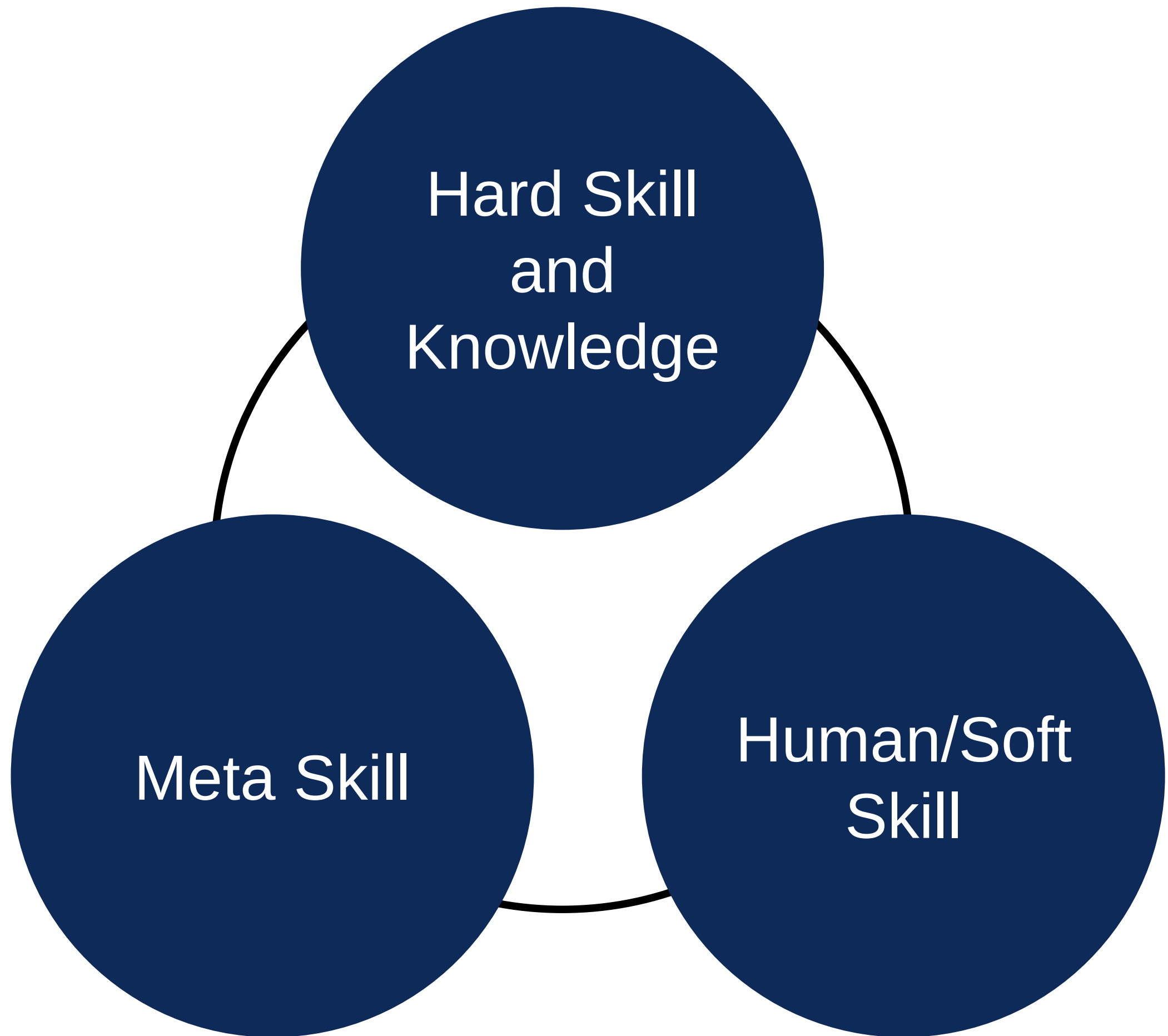

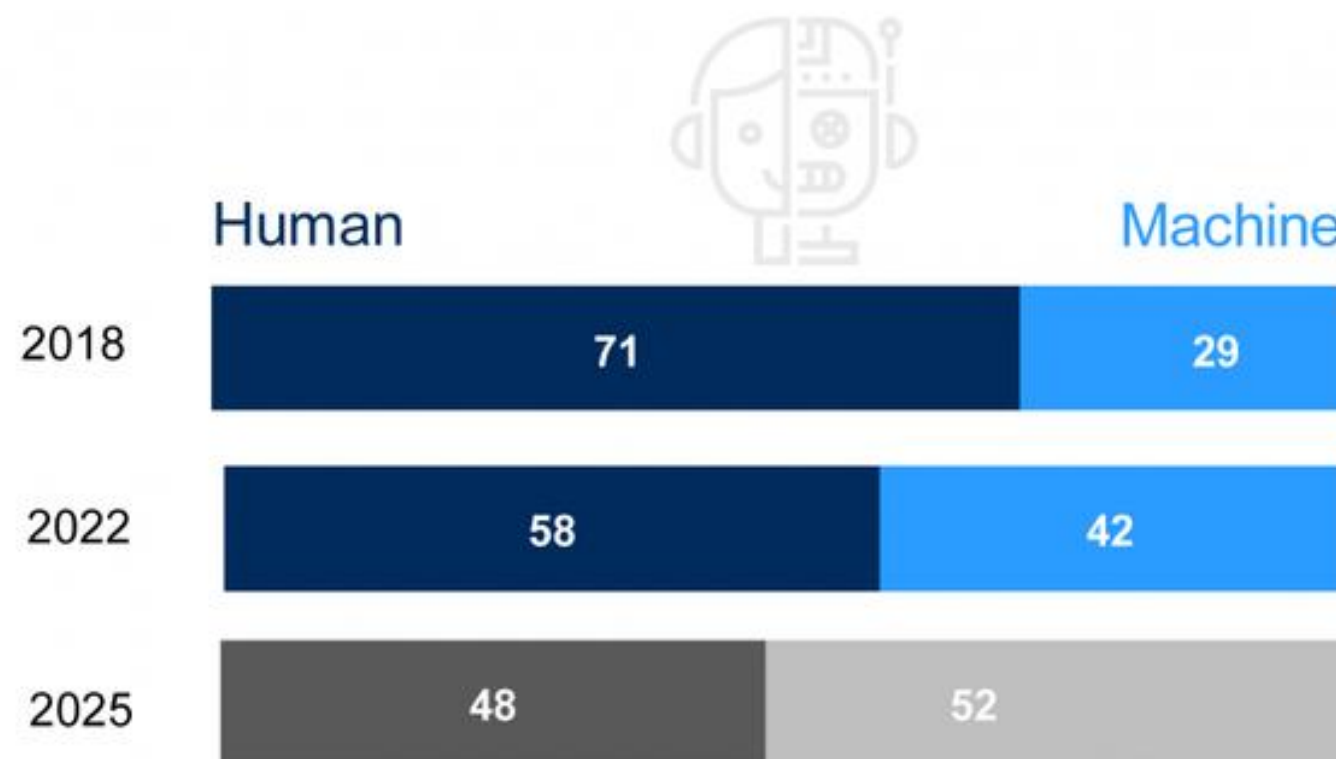

Division of labour as share of hours spent (%)

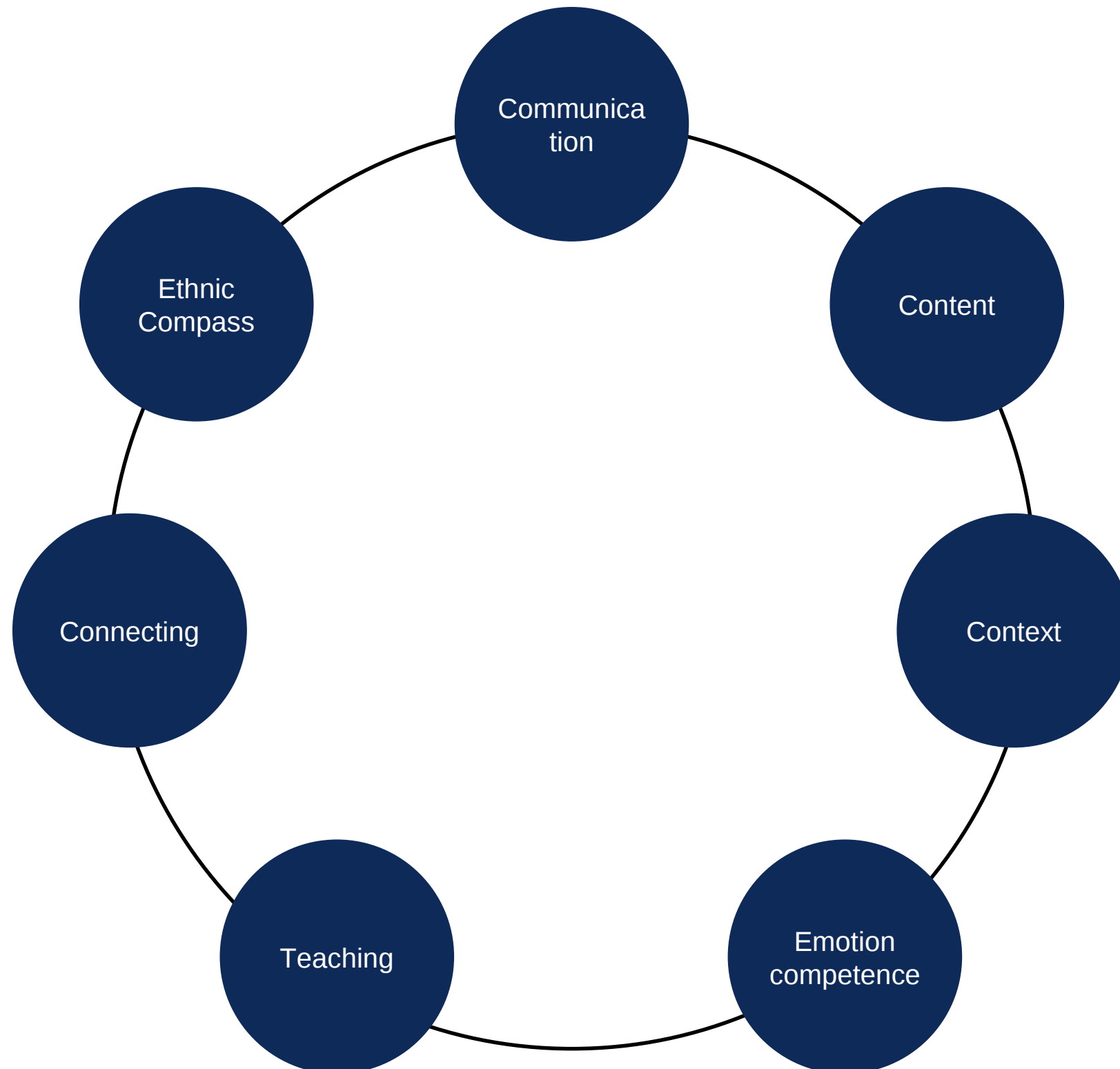
