

Extra Credit for General Psychology

Due to popular demand from previous courses taught, the instructors have agreed to provide students with the opportunity to earn extra credit by taking part in Psychological studies.

Students can choose to take part in questionnaire studies or any of the PY353 studies looking for participants. There is one questionnaire study currently available with a possibility of another one later this semester. Please contact A. Jaruwan if you would like to take part in the questionnaire.

If you would like to take part in a PY 353 study, please sign up with A. Trawin ASAP, as these studies fill up rather quickly. PY 353 studies are conducted at the Rangsit campus, so if you choose to take part in these studies, you will likely have to travel there.

Each study that a student takes part in allows a student to earn 3 extra credit points (3% of the final grade). The student must notify the researcher(s) that they are taking part in the study for extra credit for PY 200/PY 211 hosted by BE.

*Disclaimer: As all PY353 studies are designed to collect data from Thai participants, they will all be conducted in Thai. If you are not fluent in Thai, you may choose to do the following alternative assignment:

In your own words, summarize a peer-reviewed research paper in any area of Psychology. Your summary should be no longer than one A4 page. You can do as many summaries as you want. Each summary is worth 3 points (3% of your final grade). You may find the full text for many of these papers on scholar.google.com (or on another database of your choosing). DO NOT simply copy the abstract. Please print out the abstract and hand it in along with your summary to A. Trawin before the last PY 200/ PY 211 class this semester. You will also not get any credit if you:

- copy the abstract, or
- do not submit the abstract.

All extra credit points earned will be added after grade ranges are calculated, and while there is no limit to the number of studies that a student can take part in, each student will be limited to an increase of one “grade level” (e.g. C+ to B, B to B+, etc.)
