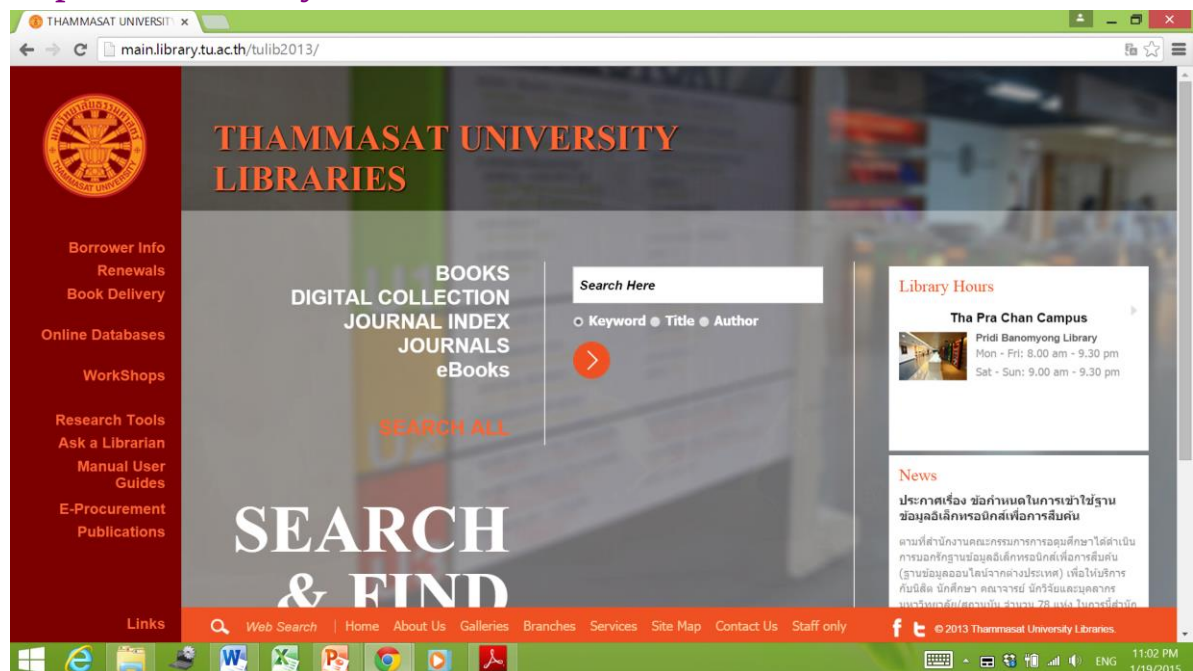

Case 1- You already have the information about the journal article you'd like to obtain.

1. Go to the library main website:

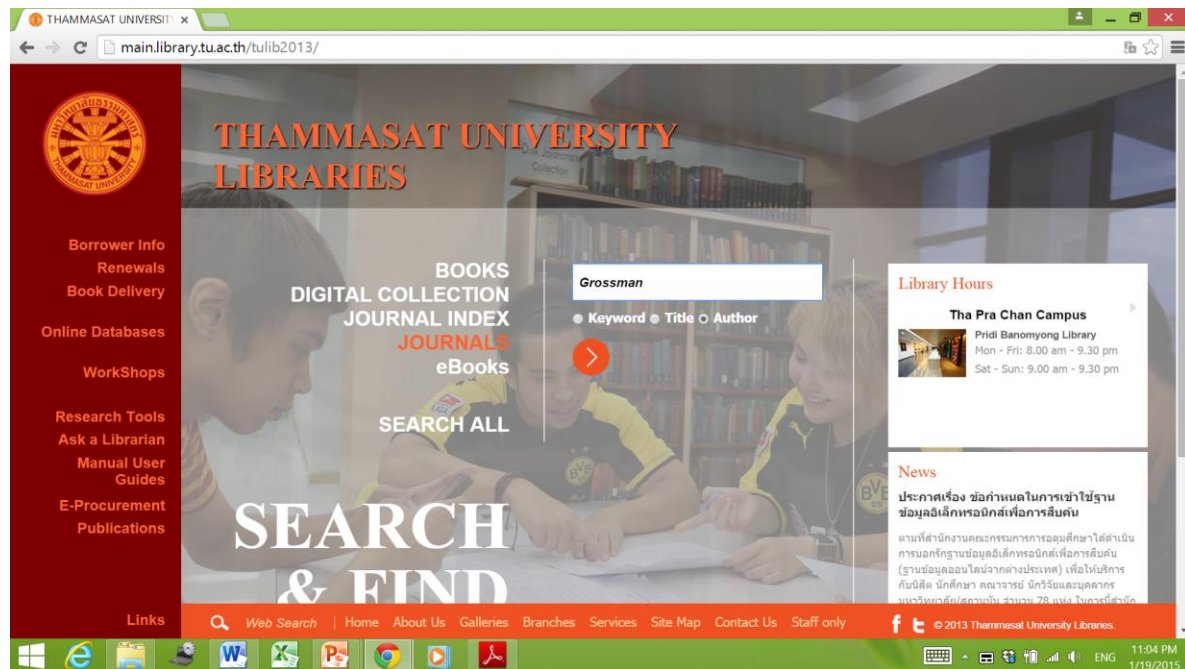
<http://main.library.tu.ac.th/tulib2013/>



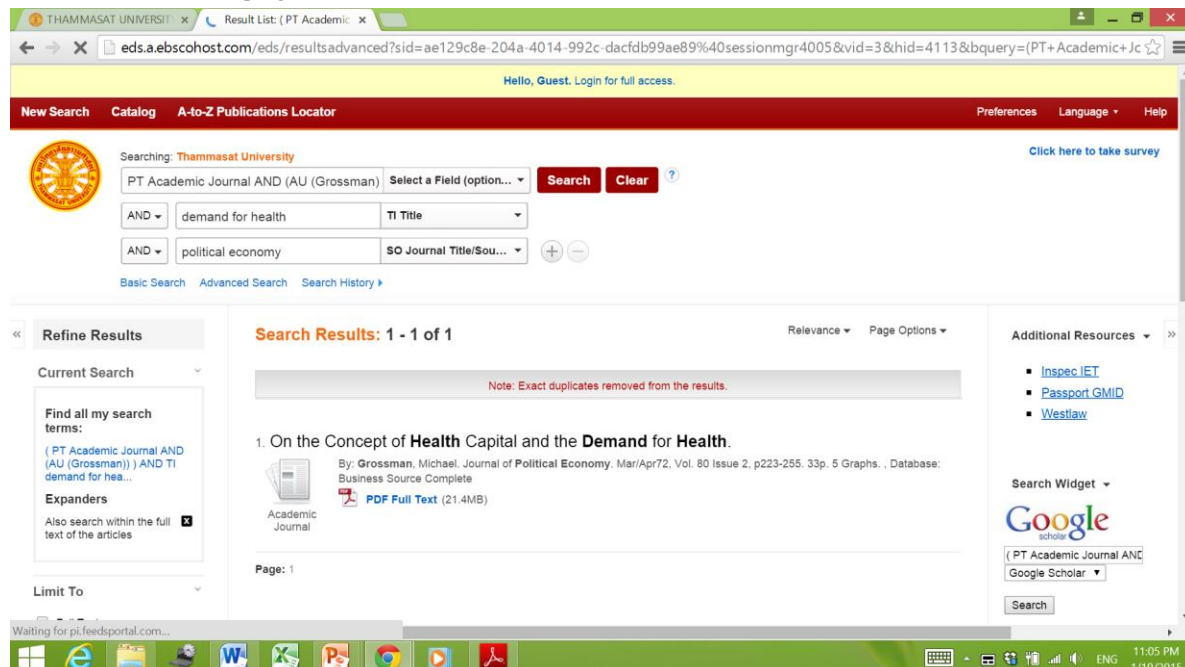
2. Click “journals” tab, and enter a keyword, title, or author. This should give you a number of articles.

Example: Grossman, M. (1972). “On the Concept of Health Capital and the Demand for Health.” *Journal of Political Economy* vol. 80, pp. 223-255.

⇒ Enter “Grossman” and select author



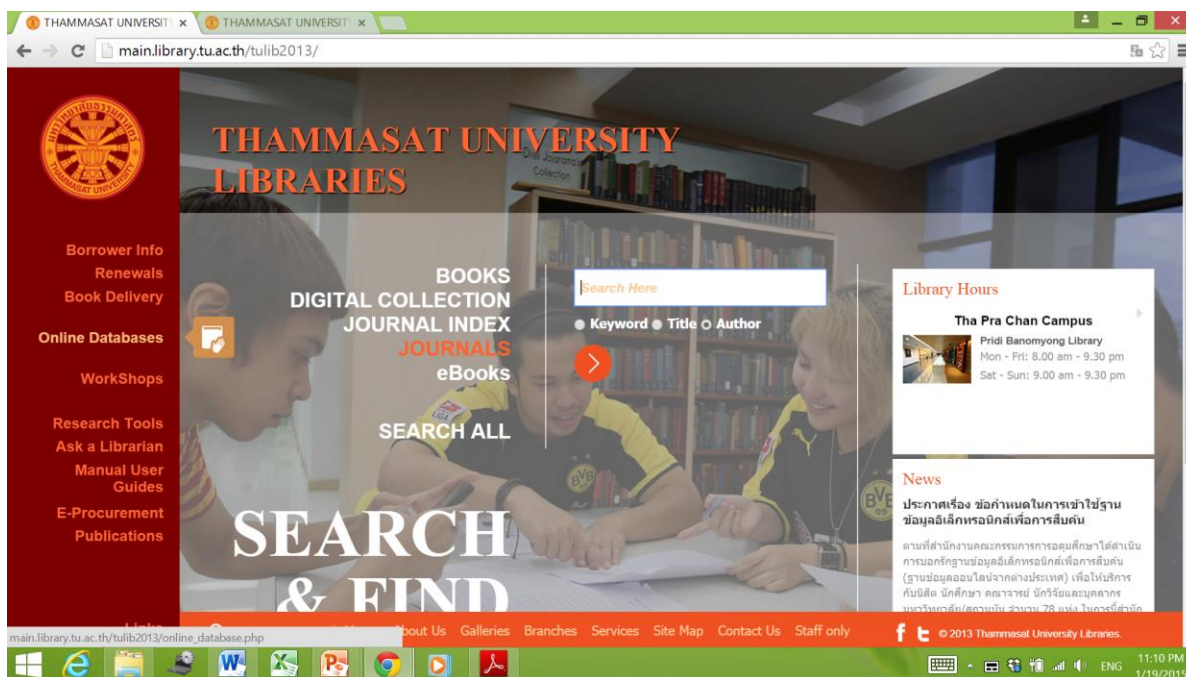
3. To narrow down the search, go to “advance search” and enter other items, e.g. journal name, title of the article.



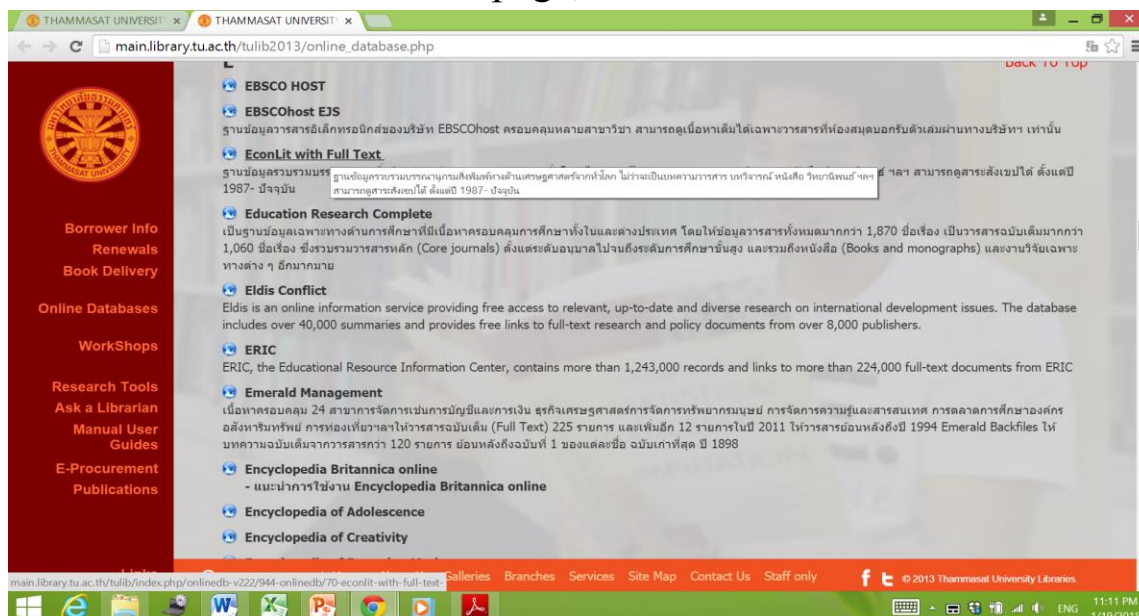
4. Download the article you want. Done!

Case 2 – You do not have any specific journal articles in mind, but you have some keywords or subject of interest.

1. From the TU library homepage, click ‘Online database’.



2. On the online database page, select the database such as ‘econlit’



Other useful databases are JSTOR, EBSCO Host, Dissertation Full text, etc.

3. After selecting database you want, enter the search terms by using ‘advance search’
