Bags under her brand are very popular among men and women. 1.1. <i>Wongsapat</i> wants to earn money to pay for the BE program. So he produces bags and uses a very similar logo. <i>Tanwarat</i> wants <i>Wongsapat</i> to stop the production and pay compensation. She sues <i>Wongsapat</i>. 1.2. <i>Saranya</i> bought a limited edition <i>DREAM ON</i> handbag for 100,000 Baht. <i>Pananya</i> wanted that bag but had no money. She decided, without thinking about a risk of losing her job at TU, to snatch the bag from <i>Saranya</i>. <i>Saranya</i> immediately seized it back. 1.3. While <i>Saranya</i> and <i>Pananya</i> fought, <i>Saranya</i>’s arm was injured. <i>Saranya</i> demands compensation from <i>Pananya</i>. 1.4. <i>Saranya</i>’s mom knew about <i>Saranya</i>’s expensive <i>Dream On</i> handbag and did not agree with her decision to buy it. <i>Saranya</i>’s mom goes to the shop and demands money back.
